Project: (LOCATION-OBJECT -ACTION): Paint Union Pacific Dining Car 4813

General Intention: This Scope of Work is intended to include all work required to complete the project described below. Contractors who submit bids are required to include and disclose in their bid all work deemed necessary to complete the project.

Task/s

Return dining car 4813 to its historic Union Pacific livery.

Introduction

This project will remove existing paint and topcoat from dining car 4813, then paint and letter the car in its historic Union Pacific livery matching the exact historic paint colors. The project will be completed between January 1, 2024, and March 15, 2024.

Background:

The Nevada State Railroad Museum Boulder City's mission is to preserve and interpret Nevada's railroad history. Dining car 4813's topcoat and paint are peeling from extended UV exposure. The car needs to be re-painted to protect the artifact's integrity. The museum has determined that the car should be restored to its Union Pacific livery to better interpret the artifact's history.

Scope of Work

The completed project will complete the following tasks.

- Prepare car for all work to ensure windows and doors remain undamaged.
- Remove topcoat and existing paint from car.
- Prime and paint the car using industrial transportation paint for maximum UV protection.
- Letter and number the car.
- Paint colors <u>must</u> match historic colors (reference photos available upon request):
 - Armor Yellow base
 - Harbor Mist Grey accents and roof
 - Aluminum silver trucks
 - o Red lettering and numbering
 - Black separation on numbers and lettering.

Dining car is approximately 80' long, 10' wide, and 13' high.

All equipment necessary to carry-out the work (i.e., high-lifts, ladders, tenting, etc.) must be provisioned by the bidder and defined in the bid response and is subject to approval of the Museum prior to its introduction in the work areas.

Schedule: Work must be completed between January 1, 2024, and March 15, 2024

Conditions: Paint colors must match historic livery and work on the artifact must comply with Department of

the Interior and National Parks Service conservation recommendations.
